2. Innovations in Curricular Design

Faculty members in the Mother Teresa university and the members in the Board of studies give their valuable suggestions in designing the curriculum and framing the syllabus for different faculties.

3. Inter disciplinary programme started

Value Education and Environmental studies are given as interdisciplinary subjects.

4. Examination reforms implemented

Students performance is evaluated at the college level by giving periodical class tests and 3 internal tests. According to the university norms, 25 marks are allotted for the internal assessment and 75 marks for the university examinations. For each theory paper 15 marks are given for the test and 5 marks for assignment and another 5 marks for seminar in the internal assessment. Out of the three internal tests, the best two are considered for the internal assessment.

- Internal tests are conducted to make the students study their lessons regularly and systematically; this will help them get better marks both in the test and in the university exams.
- The university conducts examination at the end of each semester.
- Practical examinations are conducted for science students by the end of each semester.
- For the Environmental Studies, the students are taken to suitable places on a field trip and they make a detailed study and they are asked to submit a project report, based on their study; marks are allotted for their project work.
- Visually challenged students are given the assistance of the scribes to write their internal and external examination.

17. COMMUNITY SERVICE**(i) N.S.S.**

The N.S.S. unit 11, 12, 13 are functioning effectively in our college. Awareness programme are conducted for the benefit of the student community. They are engaged in keeping the campus clean. From 23.01.2007 to 01.02.2007 the NSS special camp was organized at chettiapatti village. This 10 days camp was very useful to the student and to the village.

Under the regular Programmes, awareness was created on job opportunities in Stock Exchange share market by Geojit between 07.08.2006 and 11.08.2006. A rally was conducted on 20.08.2006 to propagate consumer Awareness. A Seminar was conducted on 23.09.2006 on Aids Awareness. On 08.10.2006 a programme was arranged on Meditation, Yoga and Personality Development. On 28.10.2006, Our NSS Volunteers participated in a rally to create a awareness on Diabetics. On 20.11.2006, another rally was arranged to propagate the importance of population control.

With the help of Esau Yoga centre, 250 saplings were planted in the college campus. On 11.12.2006 a programme was conducted on the Relationship between police and the public. Our volunteers participated in the Aids Awareness Programme conducted by Gandhigram Rural University. The Rallies and the awareness programmes were very useful to the students and to the public.

In the NSS special camp, Activities like cleaning the village, widening the road and to make Tar Roads, Opening 155 Small savings Accounts, building 5 Toilets, Conducting Free medical camp, were taken up by our Volunteers. They were very useful to the villagers. They were benefited through the camp.

The Republic Day was celebrated in the camp site and sports competitions were conducted to make the children in the village happy.

Our volunteers helped in making a park in Balaji Nagar, Municipal colony. With the instruction from the District collector, Pallapathi village was adopted and our volunteers rendered their service there.

(ii) Career Guidance and Placement Cell :

Our Students get opportunities to participate in the off campus and on campus interviews. In the off campus interview conducted at Thiagarajar college, Madurai by Wipro on 03.02.2007, 22 students from the Department of Maths and

16 students from the Department of Computer Science participated. Two of them were selected and got appointments. (iii) Youth Red Cross & Red Ribbon Club

The Youth Red Cross functions effectively for the benefit of the students. A two days First Aid Voucher Course was organized in our campus on the 7th and 8th of October 2007. 40 students got trained in First Aid. The training was given by the instructors from St. John's Ambulance, Sivakasi Branch. Certificates were given to the students. The lecture and the practical sessions were useful to the students. On 10.01.2007, an Aids Awareness Programme and a Rally was conducted. The Youth Red Cross Volunteers participated in them. It was informative to the students. Women's Day was celebrated on 11.03.2007 and a Blood Donation Camp also was organised. The doctors from the Government Hospital, Dindigul created an awareness on Blood Donation and the students donated blood.

Red Ribbon club

Red Ribbon Club organized programmes to create Aids Awareness to the students. It also arranges programmes to high light the issues of women.

On 26.06.2006 the Regional Manager of the Red Ribbon Club Mr.Jeyachandran gave a training programme to the volunteers (peer group). Nearly 25 students participated in it. They found it to be very useful and informative. They were motivated to create am awareness around their homes and in rural areas. They participated actively in group discussion.

On 20.09.2006, Mr.A.Nelson D.Co.op.B.com gave a speech on the importance of eradicating Aids. 700 students listened to the lecture. On 10.01.2007, Mrs.Fatima Devi, Inspector of Women's Police Station and Ms.Naganandhini B.A.B.L, District Judicial services and Mr.V,Kandha samy, Department of Health Development gave inspiring lectures on Women's Issues. The programme was organized in collaboration with UNDP-TAHA Peace Trust.

75 Students were benefited by it. The RRC Volunteers participated in Women's Day Celebration and Blood Donation Camp Conducted on 11.03.2007.

(iv) Youth Welfare

The Youth Welfare Conducted different programmes to create awareness on Women's Issues and conducted competitions to bring out the talents of students. Encouraged by the co-ordinator, two students participated in a TV programme. Some of our students participated in News Reading which was conducted by the Rotary club along with Parvathy's Arts College. Students participated in drawing competitions. From 13th to 15th February 07, an Entrepreneurship Camp was conducted by MT University and Youth welfare in which 100 students participated and were benefited. On 09.03.2007, Our Youth Welfare and ICFAI National College celebrated Women's Day and conducted various competitions to bring out the talents of the students. They won prizes too. On 26.03.2007 a seminar was organized by the Youth Welfare on Violence against Women. It was very informative.

(v) Fine Arts Activities

The fine Arts committee conducted various competitions to bring out the talents of our students. Though we live in an age of technology and computers, Arts play an important role in humanising the attitude of the students. Dancing, Singing, Oratorical, Verse Writing, Drawing, Vegetable Carving, Kolam, Mime, Fashion parade, Drama, Mono-Acting and Just a Minute competitions were conducted to bring out the talents of our students.

(x) Hostel

The hostel within the campus caters to the need of students from distant places 155 students are staying in the hostel. The Warden, Deputy Warden, 9

workers and the 4 student representatives help in the smooth functioning of the hostel.

Important decisions are taken by the committee. Once in a week, a meeting is gathered where the problems are discussed and solutions are given. Festivals like Vinayagar chaturti, Diwali, Christmas, New year and Pongal are celebrated in the college to create friend atmosphere and to feel that the hostel is just a home away from home.

The well in the hostel campus is deepened to cater to the needs of the students. To ensure safely, the PWD repaired the compound around the campus and the electric lights. Facilities are made for the in mates to dry their clothes and to play.

(vii) Co-Operative Stores

The co-operative stores was started under the twenty-point scheme of our former prime minister Mrs.Indira Gandhi. The stores fulfil the need of the students and the office in providing them with stationary items, Registers and Record Note Books. Along with the essential things like soap, shampoo, cosmetics and snacks like biscuits, oil etc for the inmates of the hostel. The canteen also is functioning under the stores where food items and snacks are sold at a moderate price for the benefit of the students. The management of the stores and canteen is appreciated by the authorities of the co-operative society, District Collectorate.
