## **IQAC REPORT FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2007 – 2008**

### **PROFILE OF OUR COLLEGE**

M.V.M Government Arts College (w) was founded in **1966**, with the noble vision of providing education to women students with the sustained support rendered by the Tamilnadu Government, UGC and the Local patrons, the college has grown from strength to strength. It has made several strides and has now emerged as the premier Institute, affiliated to Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal. At present, it caters to the educational needs of thousands of girls hailing from educationally and economically backward families.

With a noble aim of providing higher education to a large number of girl children. Shift II was introduced in the academic year 2007 – 2008 in Tamil, English, Economics, Commerce, Mathematics and Computer Science Departments. By the introduction of shift system 244 students and 29 guest lecturers were benefitted.

The mission is to impart liberal education committed to quality and excellence. Its quest is to mould learners into responsible citizens instilling in them leadership qualities, personal integrity and life oriented skills. Its aim is to enrich the students with efficiency and excellence.

For making quality enhancement as integral part of institutional functioning, an IQAC is constituted and the staff members work in unison for this.

**1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution**

1. To enrich the students' knowledge and skills the following Programmes were conducted.
  - Lectures / Seminars/Workshops
  - Students' orientation by expert research guides in various fields
  - Computer orientation for all students under CLP
  - Interaction with industrialists, educationists and the media
  - Bridging the gap between theory and practical by visits to factories
2. To empower the students for competing in the job market, guidance was given for communication skills, to participate in an interview and self improvement.
3. To make students career conscious and competent, training was given for various competitive examinations, developing leadership qualities and for undertaking enterprerial endeavour.

4. To provide the necessary platform for students to free off their grievances, counselling services are given by counselling cell and tutorial system.
5. To develop a sense of social awareness, fellow feelings and team spirit, various units such as **departmental associations, NSS, YRC, RRC etc.**, are functioning in the college. Students are motivated to donate liberally towards the rehabilitation funds in times of national disasters.

## 2. **New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)**

The aim of education is to bring out the latent talents of the students and foster them Under the CBCS system. The traditional method of teaching is given a go-by and the students are encouraged to choose subjects of their own choice according to their aptitude and interest. Even new courses which are more related to day to day life, providing scope for employment opportunities have been introduced. Example: EDP, Non-Technical courses etc.

During the academic year 2007-2008, the M.Sc. Geography course has been converted from Self-Financing course to Regular course. This effect has enabled rural students to get higher education without tuition fees. Steps have been initiated to submit a proposal for starting PG course in Chemistry and Biology and UG course in Physics department.

## 3. **Innovations in curricular design and transaction**

New innovations in curriculum have been introduced under CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) in the year 2007-08 and subsequently the syllabus was restructured. Restructured syllabus has been designed to provide ample scope for employment opportunities. This will equip the students to undertake projects and research work in future. Skill based elective and non-major elective papers have been introduced under the new curricular design.

“Entrepreneurship Development Programme” is a paper studied by the students of all departments during the II year (III semester) of their course. It is a paper that make the students to follow ***“Earn While You Learn” principle***. EDP has been initiated for imparting training to the interested student’s community. The techniques of Vermiculture has been explained to the students which promotes an idea about small scale industrial set up for manufacture of organic compost, preparation of vermiflyash, vermiwash, vermibeds for enhancing the yield in agriculture sector. It gives them an idea about starting a small

business or a small scale industry after completion of their degree. It improves their self confidence. Students are trained in **pottery designing, soft toys making, jewel designing, designer sarees preparation and embroidery, stitch and knit, flower vase, ice stick models, washing powder, cleaning powder and phenyl preparation** are also taught to the students, so that they can prepare them all for their home needs on their own with low investment. EDP is a strong support and best answer for each and every student who have the question “What to do after completing my degree?” in their mind, Creativity, administration and management techniques are greatly improved by learning this paper.

The paper Environmental Studies creates an awareness about the need for protecting and preserving the environment and natural resources for sustainable development. The paper “Value Education” aims at moulding the character of the students. Thus the new curriculum develops the intellectual, social and personal skills of the students. Seminar and assignments have been introduced as a part of evaluation. This activates the students to refer to the latest books to search for the latest topics in their subjects.

The objective of our syllabus is not only to educate but to empower the students and make them self reliant. Bearing this in mind, the following papers are introduced under SBE.

#### 4. Inter-disciplinary programme started

Non Major Elective is an inter-departmental course offered by each department for the students belonging to other departments. The objective is to provide mobility and flexibility outside the parent department. Two NME papers must be taken by the students before entering III Year. Since the subject is studied both by arts and science students, the paper deals with the basics of the concerned subject. It is much more practical oriented and

related with the day to day life incidents. These papers help them to prepare for competitive exams.

In the current job market, especially in the IT sector where thousands of positions are available, great stress is laid on communicative skills particularly on soft skills. The papers prescribed under the present syllabus enable the students to improve their competence level and ensure employment for them. Students fair well in the competitive exams face the interviews confidently and find easy entry into private sector, Banking, Railways and Corporate sectors.

Hence NME enables the students to move to other departments and gain some knowledge in other subjects.

Most of the administrative work in the college was computerized. The students database and the employees database are maintained in the office. The admission process is computerized by the Department of Computer Science and it is maintained by the same Department. Since the college is affiliated to Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal, the examination result processing is done by the University and the certificates are issued by the same University.

### **25. Increase in the Infrastructural facility :**

- Mathematics department is updating its own computer laboratory every year by increasing the number of computers and by introducing new software.
- The English language laboratory that existed was not adequate to meet the current needs of the students. Hence, a modern language lab has been setup with the latest gadgets and equipments. An updated software has been installed. On the whole 12 systems are available. Students have free access to this spacious, air conditioned lab. The printer is also at their disposal which is useful for their project work. The lab is also enriched with special software package-essentials of English. CD's pertaining to language skills and the colour TV, VCR and a CD player available in the lab enable the students to watch literary classics like Shakespeare's plays. By using headphones students get exposed to RP sounds and are able to improve their accent and



intonation. This lab is a great boon to Part II English students to develop their soft skills.

## **26. Technology Upgradation**

- ❖ A Computer, Printer and UPS are installed in all the departments in the College so as to enable the faculty members to maintain their records and for the preparation of internal test, Non-Major Elective Question Papers.

- Broadband connection is available in the college. This is used by the non-teaching faculty in the office to carry out some online process like students scholarship entry etc. The internet connection in the college is also utilized by the faculty members to refer and download articles for their research work.

### 30. Health Services

- ❖ Since our college is a women's college the automatic sanitary napkin vending machine is installed in the campus for the benefit of the rural women folks of our college.
- ❖ R.O. system is installed in the campus and Purified drinking water is provided for the students.
- ❖ Various health camps were conducted like Blood Group Identification and Eye camp
- ❖ During the camp Haemoglobin count is checked for the students and those with less count were identified and they were given treatments. Healthy food and medicines were provided for the needy students from the college.

An awareness camp on Anemia and Blood Donation awareness programmes had been conducted in the College and the Lab Technicians helped to identify the blood group and also helped to identify the students with less Haemoglobin count and they were given treatments

### **34. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling unit**

#### **GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING**
