### **INTRODUCTION ABOUT OUR COLLEGE**

M.V.M Government Arts College (w) was founded in **1966**, with the noble mission of providing education to women students with the sustained support rendered by the Tamilnadu Government, UGC and the Local patrons, the college has grown from strength to strength. It has made several strides and has now emerged as the premier Institute, affiliated to Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal. At present, it caters to the educational needs of thousands of girls hailing from educationally and economically backward families.

The mission is to impart liberal education committed to quality and excellence. Its quest is to mould learners into responsible citizens instilling in them leadership qualities, personal integrity and life oriented skills. Its aim is to enrich the students with efficiency and excellence.

IQAC's Annual report presents a bird's eye view of the activities of the college during the year 2008-2009 carried out with the sole aim of sustaining the quality and enhancing the efficiency of various components in education. This has been done with an action plan based on the recommendation of the quality so that the college can opt for Re-accreditation.

To enhance the quality and excellence of academic and administrative performance of the institution the following activities have been planned at the commencement of this academic year.

- To encourage the faculty participate in the conference /symposium/ workshop/ seminars and to publish articles and books in large numbers.
- To accelerate the activities/functions of the Placement cell.

#### **Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution**

- To enrich the students' knowledge and skills the following Programmes were conducted.
- To provide the necessary platform for students to free off their grievances, counselling services are given by counselling cell and tutorial system.
- To develop a sense of social awareness, fellow feelings and team spirit, various units such as **departmental associations, NSS, YRC, RRC etc.,** are functioning in the college. Students are motivated to donate liberally towards the rehabilitation funds in times of national disasters.

#### **New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)**

The aim of education is to bring out the latent talents of the students and foster them Under the CBCS system. The students are encouraged to choose subjects of their own choice according to their aptitude and interest. Even new courses which are more related to day to day life, providing scope for employment opportunities have been introduced. Example: EDP, Non-Technical courses etc.

Proposal for introducing M.Sc. Computer Science has also been submitted in the year 2008–09. The expert committee from the Mother Teresa Women's University visited the department and has granted affiliation. Further approval from the Government is awaited.

Proposal has been sent to start M.Sc. Mathematics. The main objective of the programme is to help the rural students' master mathematics and enable them to do research in mathematics,

applying mathematics in other fields. This programme is to provide skills for quality research and teaching in the field of mathematics, and a solid mathematical base so as to meet the challenges of mathematical applications to the industry and society, and to prepare graduates for Ph.D. in mathematics.

### **1. Innovations in curricular design and transaction**

Restructured syllabus has been designed to provide ample scope for employment opportunities. This will equip the students to undertake projects and research work in future. Skill based elective and non-major elective papers have been introduced under the new curricular design.

### **2. Inter disciplinary programmes started**

Non Major Elective is an inter departmental course offered by each department for the students belonging to other departments. The objective is to provide mobility and flexibility outside the parent department. Two NME papers must be taken by the students before entering III Year.

### **3. Examination reforms implemented**

Due to the implementation of CBCS pattern from the Academic year 2008 – 2009, Grade system is followed and different credits are given for different papers and the students are issued Mark Sheets with their snaps printed on it, so as to avoid fake mark sheets.

### **4. Initiative towards faculty development programme**

Faculty members of our college were keen to update the new trends and techniques in teaching their subjects. So they periodically attend various orientation programme, refresher courses, workshops, seminars and soft skills development programmes.

The printer is also at their disposal which is useful for their project work. The lab is also enriched with special software package-essentials of English. CD's pertaining to language skills and the colour TV, VCR and a CD player available in the lab enable the students to watch literary classics like Shakespeare's plays. By using headphones students get exposed to RP sounds and are able to improve their accent and intonation. This lab is a great boon to Part II English students to develop their soft skills.
