INTRODUCTION ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

M.V.M Government Arts College(w) was founded in **1966**, with the noble mission of providing education to women students with the sustained support rendered by the Tamilnadu Government, UGC and the Local patrons, the college has grown from strength to strength. It has made several strides and has now emerged as the premier Institute, affiliated to Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal. At present, it caters to the educational needs of thousands of girls hailing from educationally and economically backward families.

As time moves on, the educational scenario too undergoes drastic changes to match the needs of the various stake holders and job providers. Bearing this in mind, our faculties have brought in various changes in curriculum, teaching strategies, testing and evaluation methods.

The history of the Institution has been enriched by its growth on all sides. At present the **student strength is 2120 and the Teaching Faculty 70 and the Non-Teaching 15**. The learned Faculty 20 Ph.D holders, 57 M.Phil degree holders and many others pursuing research in their respective disciplines - are committed towards Academic Excellence.

The Curricular Programme offered by the Institution comprises 10 Under Graduate courses, 3 PG courses, 1 PG Diploma Course in the first shift and 6 Under Graduate courses in the second shift. Besides these Curricula, students are offered numerous job-oriented and vocational courses to enhance their employability. Value education also is given to students for a holistic development of their personality.

Enhanced Infrastructure facilities are the additional pride of the Institution. IQAC's Annual report presents a bird's eye view of the activities of the college during the year 2009-2010 carried out with the sole aim of sustaining the quality and enhancing the efficiency of various components in education. This has been done with an action plan based on the recommendation of the quality so that the college can opt for Re-accreditation.

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year:

To enhance the quality and excellence of academic and administrative performance of the institution the following activities have been planned at the commencement of this academic year.

- To develop the infrastructure as a need based one
- To motivate the faculty and students for research in order to enhance the quality of academic performance
- To encourage the faculty participate in the conference /symposium/ workshop/ seminars and to publish articles and books in large numbers.
- To accelerate the activities/functions of the Placement cell.

Section B:

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

To enrich the students' knowledge and skills the following Programmes were conducted.

To empower the students for competing in the job market, guidance was given for communication skills, to participate in an interview and self-improvement. To develop a sense of social awareness, fellow feelings and team spirit, various units such as **departmental associations, NSS, YRC, RRC etc.**, are functioning in the college. Students are motivated to donate liberally towards the rehabilitation funds in times of national disasters.

In the curriculum students are submitting their project works in the final semester, which will stimulate their interest in research work.

To enable the students to be responsible citizen, and inculcate civic responsibilities, **Procession and Rallies** are organized. National days like **Human Rights day, Teachers day, Pongal festivals** are celebrated.

2. **New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)**

The aim of education is to bring out the latent talents of the students and foster them Under the CBCS system. Proposal has been sent to start M.Sc. Mathematics. The main objective of the programme is to help the rural students' master mathematics and enable them to do research in mathematics, applying mathematics in other fields. This programme is to provide skills for quality research and teaching in the field of mathematics, and a solid mathematical base so as to meet the challenges of mathematical applications to the industry and society, and to prepare graduates for Ph.D. in mathematics.

During the academic year 2009-2010, the M.Sc. Geography course has been converted from Self-Financing course to Regular course. This effect has enabled rural students to get higher education without tuition fees.

Steps have been initiated to submit a proposal for starting PG course in Chemistry and Biology and UG course in Physics department.

3. **Innovations in curricular design and transaction**

“Entrepreneurship Development Programme” is a paper studied by the students of all departments during the II year (III semester) of their course. It gives them an idea about starting a small business or a small scale industry after completion of their degree. It improves their self confidence. The paper Environmental Studies creates an awareness about the need for protecting and preserving the environment and natural resources for sustainable development. The paper “Value Education” aims at moulding the character of the students. Thus the new curriculum develops the intellectual, social and personal skills of the students.

The objective of our syllabus is not only to educate but to empower the students and make them self reliant. Bearing this in mind, the following papers are introduced under SBE.

4. **Inter-disciplinary programmes started**

Non Major Elective is an inter-departmental course offered by each department for the students belonging to other departments. The objective is to provide mobility and flexibility outside the parent department. About eleven departments are there in the college and each department offers a special NME paper. Hence NME enables the students to move to other departments and gain some knowledge in other subjects.

5. **Examination reforms implemented**

The method of evaluation has undergone a drastic change. Items like quiz, seminar, assignments and projects have become tools to evaluate the student's knowledge and progress. System of continuous assessment is adopted.

During the Academic year 2009 – 2010 a grant of Rs.60,000/- had been sanctioned under UGC-XI Plan 'College Development Programme' for which a Computer, Scanner, Printer & UPS had been purchased and are utilized for printing Question Papers for Internal Tests and Model Exams etc..

6. **Initiative towards faculty development programme**

Faculty members of our college were keen to update the new trends and techniques in teaching their subjects. So they periodically attend various orientation programme, refresher courses, workshops, seminars and soft skills development programmes.

30. Health Services

All the first year students of both the shifts who were admitted in the academic year 2009 – 10 got general medical checkup. Dr. Amala Devi with the team of doctors conducted the campaign. Seven hundred students were examined and found out that 85 percent of the students were Anaemic. Dr.Amala Devi advised the students to take nutritious food and also recommended to take treatment immediately for their recovery.

The health committee in joining hand with national service scheme initiated steps to create an awareness regarding “Eradication of anemia”. The committee members approached for guidance and help from the health service of District Govt hospital, Dindigul. On 18.10.2009, we conducted a medical camp for identifying hemoglobin count of students and blood group to the first year students who are more than 650 in number.

We invited Dr. Jeyapaul, Joint Director, Health services, Dr. Subramanian, Superintendent Govt Hospital, Dindigul and Dr. Ananthan, Chief Medical Officer, Govt Hospital Dindigul and they kindly accepted our invitation. A one day programme was

conducted successfully to identify the blood group for nearly 900 I year students. Not only that, the percentage of hemoglobin was also measured, to identify the anemic students. For women community, maintaining good health with adequate hemoglobin count is most necessary. In order to provide adequate knowledge and to create awareness about blood grouping, hemoglobin count the Principal, The health committee members, NSS officers, and the Doctors worked in union.

We provided medical suggestion and treatment to I B.A History students especially to Sahaya shanthi selvi on 30.10.2009 in time at Annai Perinpam hospital, Pandian nagar, Dindigul under medical care of Dr.J.Amala Devi M.D. DGO. Nearly ten thousand rupees was spent for improving the health of that student.

On 19.08.2009 Gurulakshmi, T. Chandrika of Zoology Department students, S. Divya of Geography Department were taken to private nursing home “Meenakchi Hospital” to identify their illness and somatic problems. Dr. Uma Ramanathan diagnosed their ailments and prescribed medicines. Steps were taken for T. Chandrika, a student of Zoology Department, to get admission in Government Hospital for undergoing surgical procedure. She was then admitted, surgery was carried out successfully cared well there and returned home safely.

A seminar on the protection of environment was arranged in the College by the Rotary Club of Dindigul
