#### 2. Innovations in Curricular Design and Transactions

Mother Teresa Women's University introduced the choice based credit system, from the academic year 2008 - 09 as per the recommendations of the Tamilnadu State Council for Higher Education. Faculty members in the Mother Teresa University and the members in the Board of Studies gave their valuable suggestions in designing the curriculum and framing the syllabus. Skill based electives and non - major electives are included in the present syllabus. This facilitate and promote horizontal development. For example, a student of B.A. English Literature studies sericulture offered by the Department of Zoology and Banking Theory, Law and Practice offered by the Department of Commerce, Students from B.Sc Mathematics study English Communication Skills offered by the Department of English.

#### 3. Inter disciplinary programme started

Value Education and Environmental studies are given as interdisciplinary subjects.

#### 4. Examination reforms implemented

In the choice based credit system, students performance is evaluated at the college level by giving periodical class tests and 3 internal tests. According to the university norms, 25 marks are allotted for the internal assessment and 75 marks for the university examinations. For each theory paper 15 marks are given for the test and 5 marks for assignment and another 5 marks for seminar in the internal assessment. Out of the three internal tests, the best two are considered for the internal assessment.

- Internal tests are conducted to make the students study their lessons regularly and systematically; this will help them get better marks both in the test and in the university exams.
- $\succ$  The university conducts examination at the end of each semester.
- Practical examinations are conducted for science students by the end of each semester.
- For the Environmental Studies, the students are taken to suitable places on a field trip and they make a detailed study and they are asked to submit a project report, based on their study; marks are allotted for their project work.
- The PG students undertake individual project work. They are evaluated by the external examiners by conducting Viva Voce.
- Visually challenged students are given the assistance of the scribers to write their internal and external examination.
