FIELD VISIT (2015 - 2016)

Kerala & Pollachi Masani Amman temple

Objective:

Field visit to a place or a factory or a temple give students the opportunity to have first-hand experiences and to explore world. Cochin, Kerala:

The gravestone of Vasco da Gama can still be seen there.

From there we went to Cochin beach and enjoyed a lot. After that we went for shopping. Around 2.30 pm we had our lunch and then we went to Atharapalli falls. Some of our students and staff took bath in the water and all of us enjoyed the beauty of nature.
